### Hosted 5th Annual Women's Conference!



Each additional year of maternal education reduces the risk of child mortality by 5-10%. Additionally, children of educated mothers are 50% more likely to survive past the age of five and are more likely to attend school.

Students from food-insecure households

**43% less likely** to graduate from college.



More than 6.5 million children in the U.S. miss 15 or more days of school each year due to health-related issues. Chronic absenteeism is linked to poor academic performance and higher dropout rates.



### SPOTLIGHT on THE GAMBIA



- Subsistence Farming: Provided vegetable and fruit seeds to over **300+ families**.
- Provided sustainable clean water to underserved communities, serving **25,000+ people and building 7 boreholes from inception to date**. Children without access to clean water are at a higher risk of waterborne diseases such as diarrhea, cholera, and typhoid. Diarrhea alone is responsible for the deaths of around **525,000 children under five each year**.

#### Building a state-of-the-art educational facility:

##### JOYE Leadership Academy

- Phase 1 (Completed): Land clearing and security fencing.
- Phase 2 (Underway): Construction of primary education classrooms and administration building.
- Future Phases: Development of residences, secondary education classrooms, vocational and IT training centers, leadership centers, and recreational facilities.
- In The Gambia, only 12% of children aged 7-14 demonstrate minimal learning outcomes for reading, and 9% for numeracy. Rural areas face significant educational challenges, including lack of infrastructure and qualified teachers.
